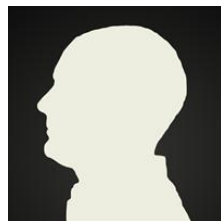

Eligibility

AIA Young Architects (licensed less than 10 years), Associate AIA members, AIAS members, full time faculty and full time students (with valid ID) are invited to submit an application.

Knowledge Exchange

In exchange for financial support to attend the conference, scholarship recipients will be required to post images and text on the AIA KnowledgeNet's [discussion forum](#) and [blog](#), [Twitter](#), [Facebook](#) to share discussions of interest and spark conversations.

Application Deadline and Submission Requirements

Applications must include: 1) a [completed registration form](#), 2) one-page resume, 3) 100-word statement of interest in the conference, and 4) a letter of support from your firm principal or school head.

All accepted scholarship recipients will receive complimentary registration to the conference valued at \$600. This includes access to tours and sessions, breakfasts, lunches, and receptions. Applicants are encouraged to use this scholarship as matching funds from your school, AIA chapters, etc. for travel.

Submit the application to kathleensimpson@aia.org as a single letter-sized PDF document titled "2013_CAE_Scholarship_FirstnameLastname.pdf." The PDF should not exceed 3mb in size or 4 pages in length.

The conference planning committee will review and communicate a decision on applications within one week of the submission.
