


AIA Knowledge Net

As a member of the community, you can **post a Message in the Discussion section** (using the “Post a Message” link in the top header) or you can **post a Blog**.

Which should I use?


Discussion is where you might post a link to an article with a comment ... or a notice about an upcoming event you think would be of interest to others.

Blog posts are articles ... these are the COTE news (regular email distribution highlighting curated content) pieces, or they might just be a thought leadership piece by a COTE KC member. We do not solicit the later, but the site is open to all.

Instructions on how to post in both of these forums are detailed, step-by-step below.


INSTRUCTIONS to create AIA Knowledge Net Discussion Post

1. Click on Post a Message in the top right.
2. Select “COTE” in the To: drop down, if you joined more than one KC (you can also cross post to other Communities, which is a great idea to help widen the discussion: for example, when we post about the Framework, I often post to COTE and COD).
3. The From: field should pre-populate with your name. Write in a subject and then copy paste, or draft your copy within in the text box. You can add hyperlinks, and any text formatting you need to express yourself, including embedded images.

4. Finally, verify your signature and click “SEND.”






INSTRUCTIONS to create AIA Knowledge Net Blog Posts

We post COTE news stories as Blog Posts, using these steps:

1. Click on the Blogs tab (shown in screen show above).
2. Click on the “Create a New Blog Post” (on the right, see below).



3. You will see this screen (below).



4. Fill in the title.
5. The blog post link will fill in automatically (you can shorten if you like).
6. Paste in the text and be sure that all embedded links are captured (or add those manually).
7. If you have an image, click on Insert to get to those instructions (and load the image in a large format if you can to ensure that it shows up well). (This is not a very image friendly platform, but you can include multiple images, and you can upload those from desktop.)

8. Add a caption and photo credits in the body of the Blog Post. (Note: Be sure that you have the rights to use the image and provide credits; this is an issue that AIA takes seriously and they will exclude images that lack proper crediting or possibly even hold or bar the post if there problems.)

9. Scroll down to see this portion of the screen (below).

10. The “associate this post” field will populate automatically

11. Under “who can read your post” please CHANGE this from “Selected Community” to “Public.” (This is important, especially because we promoted COTE news posts and others on Social Media and we intend that these will be accessible by anyone, not just AIA or COTE members.

It’s a drop down menu:

Associate this post with a community: Committee on the Environment

Who can read your blog entry?: Selected Community

Who can make comments on this?: No Comments Allowed

12. You can leave “Members Only” as the answer to “Who can make comments on this?” (even tho that seems counterintuitive).

13. When you are ready, you can click PUBLISH. (Or you can Save as Draft and come back to it later.)
