This Award Program strives to raise public awareness of the value and design excellence that architects bring to projects, no matter the limits of size and scope.

Recognition

Award winning projects will be featured and honored at the AIA's Annual Small Project Awards Presentation, entitled Ethos: Elemental and Evocative, on *Thursday, May 17, 2-3:30 p.m (AIA 2012 National Convention, Washington, DC)*. The award-winning projects will also be displayed at the 2012 AIA National Convention and Design Exposition on May 16-19, acknowledged through AIA publication and electronic media, featured on the SPP website, and circulated in the SPP Journal, Summer 2012 Edition. Past honored projects are currently being assembled into a comprehensive book for publication.

Judging Criteria

Each entry will be judged for the success with which the project meets its individual program intent and requirements. Entries will be weighed individually, not in competition with each other.

Criteria for judging will include the following:

- The submission complies with all submission requirements
- The project demonstrates exemplary skill in meeting program intent and requirements (*this criteria includes innovation and technical advancements in the design process*)
- The project achieves excellence in design (*this criteria includes the delight*

and contextual considerations required of exemplary design)

2012 Jury

Any project that credits a 2012 jury member or their firm as architect, associate architect, consultant, or client is ineligible and will be disqualified if submitted.

Communication with jurors by entrants is inappropriate and cause for disqualification. All architects of award-winning projects will be required to verify that neither they, nor persons acting on their behalf, had any written or other communication with a juror regarding any submitted project from the time of submittal to completion of the jury process.

Award Theme

The 2012 Small Projects awards program is entitled Ethos: Elemental and Evocative. There are three categories, each of which should address how a connection between place and context of the project is made. The awards organizers anticipate projects which have elemental and powerfully evocative expression.

This year we have increased the construction cost limit to include more regional diversity in the entrant pool. Recognition is given to structures that perform their intended function and go beyond to reach us at the emotional level. No project is too small to inspire!

Award Categories

Entries are to be projects of the built environment within the following categories:

Category 1. A small project construction, object, work of environmental art or architectural design element up to \$150,000.

Category 2. A small project construction, up to \$1,500,000.

Category 3. A small project construction up to \$1,500,000, which does not rely on external infrastructure as its primary power source. This "no power needed" category is a sustainable construction which may draw a maximum of one 20amp circuit of power from local infrastructure but otherwise does not require power or is entirely self-sustaining.

Applicants may enter the same project in more than one category. The entry fee is on a per category basis (e.g. the same project entered in two categories will be charged two entry fees).

The Small Project Practitioners Knowledge Community encourages submissions of projects in all building types: commercial, retail, industrial, educational, public and private, as well as residential. In addition, projects may include fully completed new and renovations or elements of built projects. There is no limitation other than the quality of the final work. We invite the submission of projects accessible to people of all abilities. New construction and renovations are equally welcome.

Projects submitted under Category three "No Power Needed", may be pro-bono or paid, completed by traditional and non-traditional practices. Our goal is to promote the practice of sustainable design and to preserve and better our environment.

Finally, the Small Project Practitioners Knowledge Community strongly encourages submissions from the many diverse Small Project Practitioner (SPP) members of the AIA and the profession.

Eligibility

- Open to architects licensed in the United States.
- Built projects completed after January 1, 2008.
- Entry photography by the submitting architect is welcomed, but there is no restriction on professional photography.
- Maximum of four entries per firm – (a single project may be entered in two different categories with applicable fees for each entry).
- **No projects are permitted that have previously received a national AIA award.**

Entry Fees

AIA members - \$150 for each entry

Nonmembers - \$300 for each entry

All entry fees are nonrefundable.

Submission Requirements

Images:

- Images include Drawings and Photos.
- Sufficient documentation to describe the project context, special considerations, and innovative design.
- Maximum 8 - minimum 4 images, arranged in the order you wish them viewed.
- Site Plan, Floor Plan(s), Sections and Elevations as appropriate to project type including North arrow and graphic scale.
- Digital parameters: 300 DPI/JPG/High Quality-Low Compression/1600 x 1200 resolution.
- Project authorship may not be revealed in any of the submitted materials.

Text:

- Written information shall be limited to 200 words, including:
- Project name and location (city and state).
- Statement of program and contextual background. In addition, include any special challenges or considerations, unique and/or innovative solutions, lessons learned, or other information pertinent to the understanding of the project.
- Project authorship may not be revealed in any of the submitted materials.

All submitters must agree to the following items:

- All drawings and photographs are products of the design architect.
- Project construction cost (not including soft costs) is accurate for the category submitted.
- Project has not received a previous national AIA design award.
- AIA Intern Declaration.
- AIA 2012 Copyright Permission Form

(Note: Project Owners may be contacted to verify information provided.)

Failure to comply with the above requirements will result in disqualification.

Submission Suggestions:

1. Jurors would like to see the project context– how it fits into the environment or surroundings, not just a closely cropped view.
2. Include plans.
3. Presentation is important. Organize your work into a coherent presentation.
4. Professional photography is ok, but not required. Photography nonetheless should be of good quality and communicate the project well.

Photography Requirements

Image Quality

Photos enable the jury to evaluate your project. An award cannot be made to a project if its relevant details cannot be determined through the submission material. Please follow the specifications above closely. The digital parameters specified above can be met with a 3-megapixel camera used at its highest resolution and with minimal compression. Our research shows that such cameras can be obtained for as little as \$150 from office supply chains or specialty retailers. Use of higher resolution cameras is acceptable and encouraged. For best results follow these simple rules.

1. Read your camera's owner's manual and know how to adjust the settings.
2. Use a tripod and the slowest speed possible if people are not in the picture. If people are in the picture shoot at no less than 1/30th of a second.
3. Use the smallest aperture possible (highest number, i.e., f32) for clearest images over the deepest field, from near to far.
4. Shoot in natural Daylight if possible.
5. Shoot in the early morning or late evening for dramatic effect.
6. If you cannot shoot in natural light, then adjust your camera's white balance for the light source (usually tungsten or fluorescent). You may also need to adjust for cloudy skies.
7. Clean and prepare the site before shooting. For example pick up paper and trash that are blowing around the ground, straighten clothing and merchandise on display, and pay attention to doors, windows, curtains and other compositional devices.

Image Editing

Images may be edited to improve contrast ratio and color balance. Images may also be cropped, but they may not be edited to alter architectural elements or context.

Images identifying authorship must be edited to retain the anonymity of the author.

Images may be black and white, sepia or color but may not be colorized black and white images. Images should represent the project, as it exists in the built environment. Artistic composition must not confuse the jury as to the nature of the project.

Any identification of the architect or firm appearing on any submitted images shall cause the entry to be disqualified. Failure to fully comply with all submission requirements shall cause the entry to be disqualified.

Submission Deadline

The submission process must be completed prior to **4:59:59 p.m. Eastern Time, February 3, 2012**. Please allow time for uploading your submission materials - no exceptions to the deadline will be made.

Board Layout

Award recipients are responsible for providing an exhibit panel for display created from their submission materials. A template will be provided for the recipients with instructions for delivery to the AIA in time for convention.

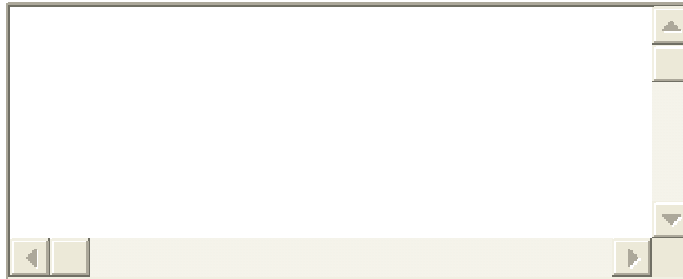
