Highlights will include cases where preservation, though often under-funded, has been a catalyst for revitalization. New Orleans had lost about a quarter of its population since 1960 when Katrina hit; the city presents its own case study in preservation efforts pre and post-storm, and is a splendid laboratory for examining the economic, social and cultural benefits of historic preservation programs.
