Day 3: Environmental Justice Friday, December 10 12-5 PM



The Climate Crisis impacts all of us. However, lower-income communities and communities of color disproportionately bear the brunt of environmental hazards and toxins threatening public health. Join us for a keynote program presented by Antoine Bryant, the new director of Planning and Development for the City of Detroit. 




