## TRANSPORTATION

### MAX Train

You can take MAX directly from the PDX Terminal to downtown (MAX station and ticket machines located near baggage claim on lower level of airport—train departs to downtown every 15 min.). Get off at the Pioneer Square North MAX Station on SW 6th & Morrison. It is about two blocks north of the Hilton. Cost from airport: \$2.50, Trip Time: approx. 40 minutes.

29. **Commonwealth Building** (formerly Equitable Building) First aluminum building clad by Pietro Belluschi, 1947. 421 SW 6th Ave.
30. **Edith Green/Wendell Wyatt Federal Building** LEED Platinum renovation of 1974 building by SERA Architects, 2013.
31. **Pioneer Courthouse** Second oldest federal building west of the Mississippi River, 1869. 700 SW 6th Ave.
32. **Pittock Mansion** French Renaissance-style "château" in the West Hills by Edward T. Foulkes, 1909.
33. **Portland Building** First major U.S. post-modern building by Michael Graves, 1982. Features the Portlandia Statue. 1120 SW 5th Ave.
