

Excludes school districts from the "public body" definition and establishes definitions for County Board, County, and school district. Requires referendum questions and subsequent statements to determine whether the voters in each county favor the payment of minimum prevailing wage rates on public works projects situated in that county and undertaken by a school district. Approval of the county referendum shall be by majority vote of the electors voting on the question in the county. In instances where a school district is located in more than one county, the referendum result shall apply solely to the public works projects constructed by a school district in the geographic territory of the county where the public works project is located.
