Scholarships for emerging professionals allow young talent the means to attend COD conferences.

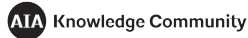
Program Sponsorships

In 2023 the Committee on Design (COD) will leave the coasts and head to the heartland to explore the architecture of "the Middle" centered around the Mississippi River watershed.

Beginning in the Delta, the Spring Conference will explore the history and architecture of New Orleans, Louisiana. This conference will investigate the origins of the city, the resulting architectural heritage, and how this circumstance continues to inform work today. In addition, several contemporary projects will be examined that reveal a culture of resiliency that has arisen in the wake of Hurricane Katrina. Tours will include work by David Adjaye, Eskew Dumez Ripple, Mithun, Pelli Clarke Pelli, the Office of Jonathan Tate, VJAA and Weiss Manfredi among others.

The Fall Conference will investigate work closer to the river's headwaters. COD will explore the architecture of Minneapolis/St. Paul. The environmental circumstance at the other end of the Mississippi is very different from the Delta, and the resulting work reflects this condition. This conference will tour projects by Henning Larsen, HGA, MSR, David Salmela, and Snow Kreilich among others. The Twin Cities are a vibrant urban environment with an architectural community routinely producing some of the nation's best work.

A limited number of members may wish to attend a prelude tour of Collegeville, Minnesota on September 20, 2023. This short trip will include a tour of Marcel Breuer's St. John's Abbey Church and University Library, as well as a stay at VJAA's Abbey Guest House and a tour of that firm's Blessed Sacrament Chapel and Church Pavilion. St. John's is a remarkable natural setting in the woods of Minnesota long viewed as a spiritual respite.
